ORDER

THIS CAUSE came before the Court at a June 6, 2018 hearing [ECF No. 60] addressing Receiver, Jonathan E. Perlman's Motion to Compel Turnover and for an Order to Show Cause [ECF No. 49], filed on June 4, 2018 against Defendants, Dustin Pillonato and Justin Ramsey. For the reasons stated in open Court, it is hereby


ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that the Receiver's Motion to Compel Turnover [ECF No. 49] is **GRANTED in part**, as follows:

1. Defendants, Pillonato and Ramsey, must turn over their laptop computers and cellphones to the Clerk's Office of the Wilkie D. Ferguson Jr. United States Courthouse, located on the 8th Floor of 400 N. Miami Avenue, FL 33128, by **June 7, 2018 at 5:00 P.M.** The Clerk's Office shall maintain control of the property while the parties brief issues relating to the Defendants' asserted claim to the Fifth Amendment's privilege against self-incrimination.
2. Pillonato and Ramsey must also turn over to the Receiver by **June 7, 2018 at 5:00 P.M.:** (i) any and all passwords and/or access codes for desktop computers and cellphones utilized in conducting business with the Corporate Defendants in FTC's

Complaint [ECF No. 1]; (ii) three Louis Vuitton backpacks; and (iii) the identity and contact information for the third unidentified person seen with Pillonato and Ramsey leaving Ramsey's home after being served with the FTC's Complaint and the Court's Temporary Restraining Order [ECF No. 12].
